2 Initiating the Rite

 ${Nick}:$

Welcome members of the ProtoGrove of the Whispering Sprits and all others joining us today. We welcome the Kindred's that will join with all of us today and may the Kindred's bless our ritual today.

Brigit the daughter of The Dagda and one of the Tuatha Dé Danann, with you watching over us may you instill in us inspiration, learning, poetry, and occult knowledge as you watch us today. Watch over us and keep us safe and fearless. Brigit please accept our sacrifice. (Blackberries)

Two Powers Meditation

Closing your eyes, take a few deep cleansing breaths. Breathing in through your nose and out through your mouth. In through your nose and out through your mouth. As you breathe, lay aside the worries, troubles and woes of the mundane world.

Pause: 4 count

We now stand between Earth and Sky. Feel your feet firmly resting upon the Earth. Know that below us flows the primal waters. Cold, dark and chaotic; filled with the potential of all life.

Allow the primal waters to enter your being. Feel the coolness of the waters as they pool within your belly, within your heart and finally, within your head.

Pause 8 count

Reaching high into the sky above, feel the illuminating radiance of the Heavens. Know that above us burns the primal fires, Warm, light and ordered; filled with the spark of all life.

Allow the primal fire to enter your being. Feel the warmth of the fires as they illuminate your mind, your heart and finally your spirit.

Pause 8 count

Feel the primal powers of Earth and Sky as they surge through you, lending strength and energy to your being.

Pause 8 count

As we open our eyes, know that we assemble as one folk to worship with a common purpose.

When you are ready open your eyes.

3 Outdwellers

{Volunteer}: Take ale outside of ritual space

{Nick}: Using milk, anoint the participants at ritual

5 Honoring the Earth Mother

 ${Nick}:$

Great Danu Mother of all,

Our life is nourished from your bounty, You give food that nourishes us, the wealth that enriches us, even the very ground we walk on O bright goddess, all joy and prosperity comes from you, and it is you who sustains us. We honor you now to thank you for the bounty you bestow upon all of us.

Great Danu accept this sacrifice.

{Nick}: Sprinkle cornmeal into the offering bowl

6 Statement of Purpose

 ${Dale}:$

We are here to celebrate the high-day of Imbolc. This high-day is dedicated to the Goddess Bríd; on this day we remember her and give to her the honor she is due. In turn, we look to see her blessing in our lives.

In the world, we are almost half way through winter. Beneath the snow the land lies dormant, waiting for the return of warmth. In our lives we now chafe against our confinement and long for the release that comes with the spring.

7 Recreating the Cosmos

{Dale}: Moves to the fire

To the flame, with this sacrifice let you become The Sacred Fire; our connection to the heavens and the gods.

{Dale}: Moves to the well

Cauldron of water, With this silver, let you become The Well; our connection to the underworld and our ancestors.

{Dale}: Moves to the tree

Mighty tree, with these sacrifice let you become The World Tree; that which connects and binds the three worlds together.

Like the tree is rooted in the land, so too do we stand firmly upon it. Like the tree is encircled by the seas, so too are we encircled by them. Like the tree dwells beneath the sky, so too do we live beneath it.

Once again we remember our place in the three realms, and await the coming forth of the kindred

9.2 Inviting the Ancestors

{Dale}: Speaks then places offering on the fire

Fáilte Sinsearach. Welcome Ancestors. We make space at our fire for our mighty ancestors, for our honored ancestors, and for our beloved ancestors.

Sinsearach, accept this sacrifice.

{Dale}: Places offering in the offering bowl

You who are of our blood and bone, you who are of our spirit and heart, you who have walked this world and left it before us.

{Dale}: Call

We remember you.

{All}: Response

We honor you.

Repeat Call/Response for a total of 3 times

9.3 Inviting the Gods

 ${Dale}:$

Fáilte Túath Dé Dannan. Welcome to our gods.

We make space at our fire for the Túath dé Dannan, for the gods of our people, and the gods of this land.

Gods, goddesses, accept this sacrifice.

{Dale}: Pours offering in the offering bowl

You who nurture our spirits, you who challenge us to grow, you who we return to when we pass from this world.

{Dale}: Call

We remember you.

{All}: Response

We honor you.

Repeat Call/Response for a total of 3 times

13 Calling for the Blessings

 ${Dale}:$

O kindred, we have made you welcome at our fire, we have honored you, and we have gifted you with sacrifices. We await your blessings.

Children of Earth, the Kindred have heard your praise, and have accepted your sacrifices. This season bring challenges, but as you stand with the gods, they will stand with you.

14 Hallowing the Blessings

{Dale}: Fills the horn then speaks.

By the Sídhe, the sinsearach, and our gods; by the light and the fire of Bríd, hallowed are these waters.

Offerings we have given, and an offerings we have been given in return.

Behold the Waters of Life!

15 Affirming the Blessings

{Dale, then remaining worshipers}: Raises the horn, speaks then drinks (or pours a small amount into the offering bowl) and passes the horn to the next worshiper.

I accept the blessings of the Kindred.

{Dale}: Speaks then pauses for a moment.

Let us reflect a moment on the blessings of the Kindred.
