2 Initiating the Rite (Dale)

*{Drummer}: Drum as participants circle around the area

{Horn Blower}: After all have circled the area and the drum stops, blow horn 3 times, then sneak

{Speaker}: Speaks after horn call

Once again we have gathered together as one people, to honor our Kindred and celebrate the changing of the seasons.

Around us the spirits of nature move, amongst us our ancestors gather and before us our gods stand tall.

At this time, in this place, we set aside all that we brought with us. We focus our thoughts and our actions on this moment while we commune with the Kindred.

3 Outdwellers (Lisa)

{Speaker}: Moves just outside the perimeter

Kindred, we have made you welcome at our fire, we have honored you, and we have gifted you with offerings. From the oracle, we have heard your blessings, and we seal our relationship with the Waters of Life.

15 Hallowing the Blessings (Dale)

{Speaker}: Fills the horn then speaks.

By the sinsearach, the Sídhe, and the Tuath Dé Dannan; by Lugh, the master of all arts, hallowed are these waters. Let those who drink of them find the bounty of summer within their lives.

{Speaker, then remaining worshipers}: Raises the horn, speaks then drinks (or pours a small amount on the ground/in the fire) and passes the horn to the next worshiper.
